Subject	Object	Possessive	Pronunciation	Example
She	Her	Hers	As it looks	She is speaking
He	Him	His	As it looks	He is speaking
They (singular)	Them	Theirs	As it looks	They are speaking
Ze	Hir	Hirs	Zhee, Here, Heres	Ze is speaking
Ze	Zir	Zirs	Zhee, Zhere, Zheres	Ze is speaking
Xe	Xem	Xyr	Zhee, Zhym, Zhyre	Xe is speaking

July 10, 1972 – Ann Arbor, Michigan becomes the first U.S. city to pass a broad gay civil rights law. The city council passes the Human Rights Code making discrimination against gays and lesbians in housing, public accommodation, and employment illegal throughout the city.
